

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

### **Erase all Sins**

Our beloved Nabi (ﷺ) said: 'Hajj wipes out whatever (sins) came before it.'

(Muslim)

### Hajj Mabrur (an accepted Hajj) is a Hajj:

Performed with Halal (lawful) income. Free of evil, sin and unjust disputes (during Hajj).

Performed according to the Sunnah.

Performed purely and sincerely for Allah Ta'ala alone and not for show.


Not followed with acts of disobedience and sin.



# Word Bank!

### Hajj

The fifth Pillar of Islam which is obligatory on Muslims who have the means to travel at least once in a life time.

### **Umrah**

A 'Mini Pilgrimage' which can be performed anytime of the year except during the days of Hajj.

#### Ihram

A requirement for Umrah and Hajj which begins with an intention and prohibits certain actions including stitched clothing for men.

### Masjid al-Haram

The Masjid wherein the Ka'bah is situated.

### Dhul Hijjah

The twelfth and final month of the Islamic calendar during which Hajj takes place.

### Ka'bah

The House of Allah Ta'ala which the Muslims face when performing Salah.

#### **Tawaf**

The circumambulation of the Ka'bah, which is done a total of seven times.

#### Sa'ee

To walk between Mount Safa and Marwah seven times after performing a Tawaf for Umrah or Hajj.

### Hajar al-Aswad

The Black Stone found in one corner of the Ka'bah. Kissing it cleanses one of sin.

### Multazam

The wall between the Door of the Ka'bah and the Black Stone. Du'as are accepted here.

### Mizab ar-Rahmah

The water outlet of mercy.

The golden spout from where rainwater from the roof of the Ka'bah falls into the Hateem.

### Hateem

The crescent shaped area that is immediately adjacent to the Ka'bah, it is in fact a part of the Ka'bah.

#### **Rukn Yamani**

The corner of the Ka'bah that faces Yemen.

### Kiswah

The cloth of the Glorious Ka'bah.

### Maqam Ibraheem

A place near the Ka'bah where there is a structure containing the footprints of Nabi Ibraheem alyahis salaam.

### **Zam Zam**

A special blessed water found in a well in Makkah close by to the Ka'bah. Whatever intention this water is drank with, Allah Ta'ala fulfils that.

### **Talbiyah**

The phrases, "Labbayk Allahumma labbayk. Labbayka..." (Here | am at your service. Oh Allah! Here | am at your service.).

### Meeqat

The boundaries set by our beloved Nabi which cannot be crossed without Ihram.

### Qiran

A type of Hajj where the Pilgrim performs both Hajj and Umrah with a single intention and Ihram.

#### Ramee

The pelting of the Jamarat.

### **Tamattu**

A second type of Hajj where the Pilgrim performs Hajj and Umrah with two separate Ihrams and intentions.

#### Nahr

Animal sacrifice

#### **Ifrad**

A third type of Hajj where the Pilgrim enters the state of Ihram and performs Hajj only. Umrah will not be performed.

### Halaq/Qasr

Shaving or trimming the hair.

#### Mina

The location where Pilgrims stay from Fajr on the 8th of Dhul Hijjah

#### **Arafat**

A place 20 km plus from Ka'bah where Pilgrims gather on the 9th of Dhul Hijjah in worship.

### Muzdalifah

From Arafat, after sunset Pilgrims spend the night here.

#### **Jamarat**

The three pillars which Pilgrims pelt with pebbles that they collected in Muzdalifah.

### Tawaf az-Ziyarah

A compulsory Tawaf to be performed during Hajj.

### Tawaf al-Wida

The departing Tawaf which is performed anytime after Tawaf az-Ziyarah. It is the final Wajib of Hajj.

### Rawdah

The blessed resting place of our beloved Nabi

### **Ziyarah**

Visiting the blessed city, Masjid and grave of our beloved Nabi

#### Jabal ar-Rahmah

A small mount located in Arafat where Pilgrims gather and worship in hope of forgiveness.



## **What Happens** in Hajj?



A basic break down



Millions of Muslims arrive from around the world.



Everyone must enter the state of Ihram which includes wearing two white sheets for men.



Everyone arrives in Makkah eager to see the Ka'bah and make Du'a.



They perform Tawaf (going round the Ka'bah seven times)



They perform Sa'ee (walking between Mount Safa and Marwah seven times)



Everyone will go to Mina which is a vast area with large tents.



A main part of Hajj is the worship in a place called Arafat.



One night is spent in Muzdilafah. Here, pebbles for Ramee (pelting) are collected.




First the Haji (Pilgrim) will do Ramee, and then Nahr (animal sacrifice). Thereafter Halaq/Qasr (shave/trim the hair). By doing this they are out of Ihram.



# When I saw the Glorious Ka'bah


It is the Ka'bah; the House of Allah. When I saw it, I said Subhanallah, To others it may be, a cube in black, But found I did, a yearn to go back.

With others to share, a change to make.



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# Hajar al-Aswad

### Read and learn about the Black Stone



The Hajar al-Aswad which means 'Black Stone' is located in the eastern corner of the Ka'bah. Hajar al-Aswad

Stone Black

The Hajar al-Aswad is a stone from Jannah which was given to Nabi Ibraheem alayhis salam to place in the corner of the Ka'bah.

Those performing Tawaf, start and end each round of the Tawaf at the Hajar al-Aswad.





From a Hadeeth we learn that the Black Stone was actually whiter than milk, but the sins of man have turned it black. [Tirmidhi]

This stone has been kissed by many Prophets including our beloved Nabi and many pious people including the Sahabah.





"The Hajar al-Aswad and Maqam Ibraheem are two jewels from the jewels of Paradise. Had Allah (Ta'ala) not concealed their radiance, they would illuminate everything between the east and the west." [Tirmidhi]

Our beloved Nabi has told us that on the day of Qiyamah the Hajar al-Aswad will have two eyes and a tongue and will testify to the Imaan of all those who kissed it.

Foot prints of Nabi Ibraheem alayhis salam stored within the 'Maqam Ibraheem'



Did you know? The Hajar al-Aswad was originally one full stone. However, due to some historical events, it is now eight small stones of different sizes. It has been attached to a large stone and encased in a silver frame.

### Story of Zam Zam

Allah Ta'ala instructed Nabi Ibraheem alayhis salam to take his wife Hajar alayhas salam and son Ismaeel alayhis salam to a place called Makkah.



Makkah at the time was an empty desert, where no one lived. There was no food nor water.



As difficult as it was to leave them in such a place, Nabi Ibraheem alayhis salam left them and returned home.



When she reached Marwah the seventh time, she saw an angel strike his wing on the ground and water began gushing. Hajar alayhas salam gathered as much water as possible.



She then rushed to a mountain in the opposite direction known as Marwah. She rushed back and forth between these two mountains a total of seven times.




After some time they were in desperate need for water. Hajar alayhas salam went to a mountain near by, which we know as Safa to see if anyone was in sight. Sadly there was no one.




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

### Learn Some Virtues & Actions Related to Dhul Hijjah

Our beloved Nabi sallallahu alayhi wasallam fasted the first nine days of Dhul Hijjah. (Abu Dawud)

The fast of each of these days is equal to the fast of a whole year! (Tirmidhi, Ibn Majah)

The worship of each night, during the first 10 days, is equal to the worship of Laylatul Qadr. (Tirmidhi)

Fasting will compensate for the (minor) sins of the past and the coming year. (Muslim, Tirmidhi)

The sacrifice is accepted by Allah Ta'ala before the blood reaches the ground. (Tirmidhi)

> It is Wajib to read immediately after every Fardh Salah

Arafah Day (9th Dhul Hijjah)

Udhiya (Animal Sacrifice)

The day of Arafah is equivalent to ten thousand days i.e. in virtue. (At-Targheeb wat-Tarheeb)

The most beloved action to Allah Ta'ala on Yawm an-Nahr is animal sacrifice (Tirmidhi).

Read from the Fajr of 9th Dhul Hijjah till the Asr of 13th Dhul Hijjah

### For the Pilgrim/Haji

"Allah draws near and boasts of His servants to the angels..."
(Muslim)

"Shaytan is not seen on a day, apart from the day of Badr, in which he looks smaller, more defeated, more despised and more infuriated than on the Day of Arafah (due to Allah forgiving His servants)..."
(Bayhagi)

### For those at Home

Regarding fasting on the day of Arafah, our beloved Nabi sallallahu alayhi wassalam said, 'It compensates for the (minor) sins of the past and the coming year.' (Muslim)

# Jamar Let's learn about pelting the Jamar

pelting the Jamarat

### Read the information and colour the picture.

The Jamarat are 3 pillars which symbolise Shaytan.


Pilgrims pelt the Jamarat for three days.

On the first day of Ramee, only one pillar is pelted. On the rest of the days, all three are pelted.

Thinking this is Shaytan some people throw slippers etc. This practice is incorrect.

Du'as after this are accepted.

There is a small wall around each pillar. This is the area each pebble must fall in to.



The pebbles for pelting are collected from Muzdalifah

Each person will throw seven pebbles per Jamarat.

In a Hadeeth we find that, every pebble that receives acceptance, is lifted to the heavens

### History

These three pillars represent the three times Shaytan tried to stop Ibraheem alayhis salam from completing Allah Ta'ala's command of sacrificing Ismaeel alayhis salam.

There are three Jamarat:

- 1) Jamaratul Ula/Sugra The first pillar/ smallest pillar which is situated near Masjid Khayf.
- 2) Jamaratul Wusta The pillar which is situated in the middle.
- 3) Jamaratul Kubra/ Aqaba- The largest Jamarah

Nabi Ibraheem alayhis salam threw pebbles at Shaytan each time Shaytan came to stop him.

Till the Day of Qiyamah this action of Ibraheem alayhis salam will be remembered and replicated by millions of Hujjaj (Pilgrims)!

## What is Hajj?

Hajj is a Pilgrimage that takes place in the month of Dhul Hijjah. Hajj is also the fifth pillar of Islam.

Hajj is compulsory upon every sane and mature believer who possesses the means to perform Hajj.



There are many benefits of Hajj from which a few are:

- · All sins are forgiven
- · Jannah is promised
- Safety from poverty

### What is Ihram?

Ihram is a special state a person enters in order to perform Umrah or Hajj. When in Ihram certain things become prohibited. The two white sheets worn by men is also known as Ihram.

### Can children go for Hajj?

Yes, children can go for Hajj and they will get a lot of reward. However, this will not be their Fardh Hajj and therefore the obligation will still remain.



### How should time be spent during Hajj?

The most important aspect is to ensure no sins are committed and no time is wasted.

Along with this, all forms of Ibadah are recommended which will include:

- Tawaf and spending time in the Haramayn.
- Dhikr, Durood and recitation of the Glorious Qur'an.
- Performing all Salah in the Haramayn with Jama'ah.
- Reading Masnoon Du'as and following Sunnah practices.
- Making as much Du'a as possible.
- Try to perform Salah in the Haramayn with Jama'ah.

### What is the farewell Hajj?

The farewell Hajj is the final Hajj Nabi (ﷺ) performed a year before his demise. (10 AH)


### When did Hajj become compulsory?

Hajj became compulsory in the 9th year of Hijrah.



### Let's Perform Umrah

### Let's learn what happens in Umrah.

Umrah is a 'Mini Hajj' which is Sunnah and can be performed anytime during the year except for the days of Hajj.



### Virtues of Umrah

- 1. One Umrah is an expiation for the sins committed between it and another Umrah. (Bukhari, Muslim)
- 2. To perform one Umrah in Ramadhan is equivalent to a Hajj.


Note: In another narration there is an addition of the words 'with me'.

(Muslim)

3. The performers of Hajj and Umrah are deputations of Allah Ta'ala. If they call Him, He answers them and if they seek His Forgiveness, He forgives them. (Ibn Majah)

To wear Ihram whilst already in Makkah, Pilgrims must go to Masjid A'ishah to make the Intention.






